Practitioner's Education, Certification and Experience

This 3-year, 3,000 hour program included more than 1,000 hours of clinical practice. Ms. McDanel was certified in 2005 by the National Certification Commission of Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine (NCCAOM) as a Diplomate in Oriental Medicine. In addition, in 2005 she was Board Certified by the NCCAOM in acupuncture and Chinese herbs. Ms. McDanel has also been certified in Clean Needle Technique from the Council of Colleges of Acupuncture & Oriental Medicine.

Ms. McDanel is a licensed acupuncturist in the State of Colorado. No licenses, certificates or registrations have ever been revoked. Ms. McDanel has training and experience in the recommendation and application of adjunctive therapies and herbs as defined by traditional oriental medical concepts. These adjunctive therapies include cupping, tui na, moxibustion, auriculotherapy, and dietary and lifestyle recommendations.

Ms. McDanel also earned a Bachelor's of Science from Duke University in biology in 1997. She has been in private practice since 2005.
